

Copies of the book will be available to purchase that day and Dr. Alaimo will sign books at the end of the event.

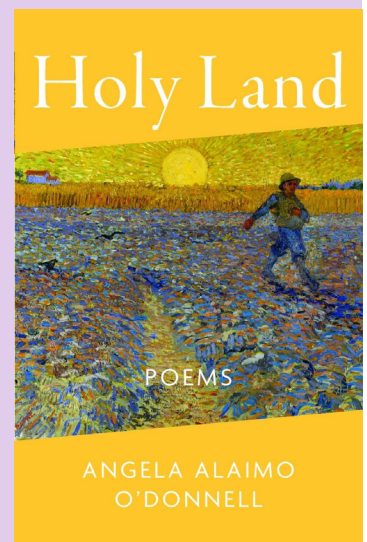
