The Pastor's Corner



Dear sisters and brothers,

This Wednesday, September 17, is the Feast of the Stigmata of St. Francis of Assisi. This event occurred on the mountainside of Mt. Alvernia in 1224. While praying, St. Francis had a vision of an angel and of Christ fastened to the cross.

Francis's body then received the stigmata, a miraculous imprint of the wounds Jesus suffered during his crucifixion, including nail prints in his hands and feet, and a wound to his side that bled. The stigmata remained on St. Francis' body until his death on October 3, 1226. He was the only saint on the Catholic calendar until St. Padre Pio, the Capuchin Franciscan, had it in the last century.

There had been no witnesses to this receiving of Stigmata of St. Francis. There were visible marks on his body, and he decided to

share this experience with his brothers. The stigmata never disappeared and were present until Francis' death. The Franciscans have commemorated the Feast of the Stigmata of St. Francis since it was approved by Pope Alexander IV and Pope Benedict XI. The example of St. Francis is that we all have to carry our Cross in one or more unique ways in our spiritual lives.

In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus proclaims that "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross and follow me." Suffering is the price we pay for true discipleship. Life has many difficult encounters, and it may seem overbearing. However, suffering-laden discipleship also entails unparalleled promise. To lose one's life for the Gospel means salvation. Sisters and brothers, let us take up our true Cross each day!

Launches

Father Mychal Judge, OFM Building Fund



The Church of St. Francis of Assisi Parish officially launched the Father Mychal Judge, OFM Building Fund on September 11, 2024. Father Mychal was an NYC Fire Department chaplain who died responding to the World Trade Center attack on 9/11/2001, along with 342 FDNY firefighters.

Father Mychal lived in our beloved parish for many years. He always loved the architecture and legacy of spirituality of the Church of St. Francis of Assisi. This building fund is intended to defray the expenses of renovation, repair, and replacement within the physical plant of our church, the parish house, and the school, which houses our adult education program and 12 step programs. All three buildings are aging and need repair, including electrical work, extensive plumbing, repointing bricks, HVAC repairs, carpen-

try renovations, painting, and scaffolds to clean out drains around all three buildings, plus numerous door and window replacements.

A Construction Committee is being formed with skilled members of the building and constructions trades plus contractors. To donate, you can send checks or cash to:
