Dear sisters and brothers.

Listening to and watching all the drama surrounding the current presidential election, I hope and pray that Wisdom prevails. Today's first reading from the Book of Wisdom states:

"I prayed and prudence was given me.

I pleaded and the spirit of wisdom came to me." In the Old
Testament, Wisdom literature is personified by a woman. This
maternal force properly guides our action through sensible and
inspiring words — not insults and insinuations.

That is echoed in today's Gospel from Mark about the rich young man. He knew and obeyed all the Ten Commandments. However, he was unwilling to change his life to follow the radical teachings of Jesus Christ. The rich are not condemned by Jesus Christ, but they are called to ongoing conversion, like all of us, to change for the best. Jesus gives all hope when he pronounced "For human beings it is impossible, but not for God. All things are possible for God."
