### The Pastor's Corner



Dear sisters and brothers,

This weekend begins the new liturgical year (Cycle C) in our Roman Catholic calendar year. A number of our parishioners created an Advent theme which is pertinent to our living Franciscan tradition. The theme is "Light of the World, Care for Creation." This theme links our

Biblical readings for the season of Advent with Pope Francis' encyclical "Laudato Si — In Praise Of." This encyclical is about humanity's obligation to take cate of Holy Mother Earth. St. Francis of Assisi is the patron saint of ecology, and that is the reason why this Franciscan parish is greatly concerned about this seminal issue in our civilization.

The year 2025 is designated by the Catholic Church as a Jubilee Year of Hope for our precious Mother Earth. 2025 is also the 800th Anniversary of the oldest example of Italian literature, "The Canticle of the Creatures," a long poem composed by St. Francis of Assisi on the beauty of nature. This evocative poem is the inspiration for Pope Francis' encycli-

cal "Laudato Si." This Advent theme of "Light of the World, Care for Creation" will pave the way for the 800th anniversary of "The Canticles of the Creatures" during calendar year 2025.

The readings for the First Sunday of Advent talk of the second coming of Jesus Christ. The opening verse from the passage from the prophet Jeremiah says "The days are coming, says the Lord, when I will fulfill the promise." The promise to be fulfilled is the birth of Jesus Christ on Earth. This is echoed in the final verse from the passage of the Gospel of Luke: "Be vigilant at all times and pray that you have the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand before the Son of Man."

We are all called to be vigilant this Advent season as we are guided by the light of Christ and truly care for all of God's Creation on Earth.

#### **CHRISTMAS FLOWER DONATIONS**


Christmas trees, wreaths and poinsettias will again adorn our sanctuary this Christmas. We offer them to honor the birth

# WINTER PARISH RETREAT: JUBILEE — LIBERTY AND RENEWAL
