A CHRISTMAS MESSAGE OF LOVE, JOY AND HOPE FROM FATHER BRIAN

Last Christmas, in 2023, the Franciscan community celebrated the 800th anniversary of the first Christmas Creche. On that momentous Christmas Eve in 1223, in the medieval town of Greccio, Italy, St. Francis of Assisi initiated a live reenactment of the birth of Jesus. Townspeople portrayed the Holy Family, shepherds, and angels, accompanied by real livestock, bringing the Nativity scene to life. This historic event marked the first recorded Christmas Creche, establishing a cherished tradition that has since spread across the globe.

Next year, in 2025, we will celebrate another milestone — the 800th anniversary of "The Canticle of the Creatures," St. Francis's lyrical poem, recognized as the oldest piece of recorded Italian literature. This profound work highlights the importance of God's Creation, inspiring the papal encyclical Laudato Si' by Pope Francis, which means "In praise of." It is a call for all of us to praise and care for our common home, Earth. Throughout 2025, our parish will honor this legacy by focusing on the care and our shared responsibility for our planet, Holy Mother Earth!

During this blessed Christmas season, we are reminded of the words from the Gospel of John: "The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us." Jesus, fully human and fully divine, entered our world to bring hope and salvation. REASSESSMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

After a careful reflection with the friars, staff members and fellow parishioners, we are making a pastoral change on how we administer the anointing of the sick on Thursdays. Beginning on Thursday, January 2, the communal anointing of the sick will be administered at the 12 noon Mass only for the seriously sick, the elderly, those preparing for a medical procedure, and those suffering from mental illness.

The US Catholic Catechism for Adults teaches of the sacrament of the anointing of the sick that "this sacrament of healing is given to a person who is seriously ill or in danger of death due to sickness or old age. Elderly people may be anointed if they are in a weak condition though no dangerous illness is present." We ask that everyone at the 12 noon Mass on Thursdays to abide by this church teaching. The parish staff will plan 4 communal anointing of the sick ceremonies on weekends during the calendar year.

On Thursday, December 26, the Feast of St. Stephen, there will be one Mass at 11:00am. There will be no confessions, and church offices will be closed.

We will celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family on Sunday, December 29. Masses will be held at our regular times.

On Monday, December 30, New Year's Eve, and Thursday, January 2, we will have Masses at 7:30am, 12:00pm, and 5:30pm. Confessions will be available from 11am-12pm only.

On New Year's Day, there will be one Mass at 11:00am. There will be no confessions, and church offices will be closed.
