Dear sisters and brothers,

What a whirlwind of fear that has descended upon our nation this past week! Undocumented people fearful of mass deportations. Budget cuts to our Federal climate change projects.

Birthright citizenship being threatened. The Affordable Care Act and other health care benefits are subject to cuts. WOW!

Our former governor and former president, Franklin D. Roosevelt once said "There is nothing to fear but fear itself." There is true genuine fear in our great nation. But it is how we face these fears with faith that makes the difference in how we live and cope in fearful times. Many of our parishioners are helping immigrants to know their rights as human beings. Our Laudato Si Circle and Converge Ministry are addressing climate change in a book club that begins this Monday, February 3. Some of our parishioners are lawyers and professors who are upholding the right of birthright citizenry. Many of our parishioners are in the health care field and are vigorously defending the right to health care. I am honored and privileged to serve in a parish that is active in their meaningful "ministries" to serve the People of God. More has to be done, and we cannot rest on our laurels. The closing words of today's Gospel passage from Luke come from Simeon, an elder who waited for many years to see the Savior, Jesus Christ. He encounters the child Jesus in the Temple, holds him in his arms, and says with faith and gratitude "for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all peoples: a light of revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel."

Let the light of Christ shine on our nation during these difficult times!

It's not all bad news. We're still far from where we want to be, but we are moving in the right direction, and we are doing better than our worst-case scenario.

According to the International Energy Agency (IEA), our Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is decoupling from our carbon emissions. This trend is also happening in the EU, Japan, Korea, and Australia. The IEA projects that CO2 emissions may be nearing a peak, so the whole world is likely to reach this "absolute decoupling" very soon! It is possible to be both rich and green.

Correspondingly, the mortality rate of children under 5 has dropped. There's a connection here. We're all connected. The small actions you're taking are working and have not been in vain.
