The Pastor's Corner



Dear sisters and brothers,

During the next three Sundays — March 23 till April 6 — our catechumens (6 English, 18 Korean) in the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA) will go through the Rite of Scrutinies. The "Scrutinies" are for those preparing for full entrance into

the Catholic Church, who are led through prayerful reflections designed to help them turn from sin and grow in holiness. These "scrutinies" prepare these catechumens for full initiation into the Church on the Easter Vigil, April 19, 2025.

Today's readings "scrutinize" all faithful Catholics through the presence of Almighty God. In our first reading from the Book of Exodus, Moses is "scrutinized" by God. God initiated this encounter out of love for His people. In revealing himself to Moses through the burning bush, God twice proclaimed that He is the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. God entrusted to Moses that He "is to be remembered through all generations."

This message is re-emphasized in today's Gospel passage from Luke. Jesus presents a parable (a teaching device) on how the vulnerable fig tree is like our spiritual life. We are given a choice: we can accept this invitation to change our ways and bear fruit OR we can remain stagnant and perish spiritually.

Our 24 catechumens and 15 candidates have made a choice to follow Jesus through these upcoming Scrutinies. May we be spiritually edified by their example!
