The Pastor's Corner



Dear sisters and brothers,

This week the Church and the world lost a true Shepherd of the Catholic Church, a beacon of hope and voice of penetrating truth—Pope Francis, the first Pope of the Americas!

Pope Francis was the prophetic advocate for the poor and the dispossessed, the unborn and the immigrant, the victims of war and the Earth which is our common home. Pope Francis' vision of a synodal church—the People of God together. Our Church is nourished by Word and Sacrament, missionary on its outreach including the poor in spirit and the poor in poverty.

On Easter Sunday, we celebrated the victory of Christ over death itself, and the foundation for our belief that we live on this earth on a journey that leads to eternity and the loving embrace of our God. Pope Francis lived that journey preaching the Gospel and embracing the world we which we live.

We thank Pope Francis for the grace he has brought among us.

The period of liturgical time between the Easter Vigil and Pentecost Sunday is the Easter Season. For those participating in the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA), this same period is known as the "Mystagogia" which refers to a period of ongoing reflection and learning about the "mysteries" of the Church, particularly after the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist. We are now living and bearing witness in this time period!

For the next four Sundays, we will be listening to the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles. This passage written by St. Luke portrays the situation in which the Apostles find themselves after the Resurrection. We are called to be like these Apostles—to be emboldened to serve as emissaries of God's Grace. Their encounter with the Risen Jesus renders them to become new people.

In today's Gospel, all of us can identify in a way with "Doubting Thomas" who could not initially believe that Jesus actually rose from the dead. When he saw Jesus, this strengthened his faith in Christ Jesus. For us, we do not require a sign or proof. Jesus blesses all who believe in the Resurrection without seeing or witnessing it. This message assures us that we continue to receive the Lord's blessing today as we gather in his mercy and love.
