The Pastor's Corner



Dear sisters and brothers,

Greetings!

Last Saturday afternoon, I was taking an express train from Brooklyn to go back to our parish near Penn Station. Along the way, a disturbed individual was harassing and threatening a frightened female passenger. Many of the passengers moved away to avoid responsibility to protect this frightened lady. Not one, not two but three Good Samaritans came to the rescue of this woman in fear. Myself, plus two street-smart female passengers instructed the disturbed person to stay away from the fearful woman

and get off at the next stop. To no surprise, he backed away and got off at the next stop. The woman in fear thanked us profusely and yelled out loud "Where were the rest of you? I needed help!" Suffice to say, this scenario happens more often on city subways and buses than we care to admit. Yes, it is a risk to be a Good Samaritan, but it is a worthwhile risk.

The readings this weekend invite us a to live out the Gospel mandate to love God and to love our neighbor equally. In the first reading from the Book of Deuteronomy, Moses exhorts the people to obey God by following the commandments given at Mt. Sinai "when you return to the Lord, your God, with all your heart and all your soul." This based in the law of the Torah for Jews prescribed by Moses.

This Gospel passage from St. Luke emerges from a debate between Jesus and a scholar of the Torah. When he asks Jesus what must I do to inherit eternal life—Jesus asks him what is written in the law and the scholar cites directly from the Torah of the love of God and love of neighbor. However, the real question posed by the scholar to Jesus is the parable of the Good Samaritan when he asks "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus tells the parable of how a priest and a Levite initially avoided the beaten victim and went another way. What is remarkable is that a Samaritan who not a Jew or even from the local area, courageously showed compassion for the victim with his heart, hands and funds from his own pocket. When Jesus asked the scholar of the law who is the true neighbor, the scholar replied, "The one who treated him with mercy."

Sisters and brothers, this ancient parable is relevant now as it was over two thousand years ago. We live in a pluralistic city in a pluralistic country where the least likely of persons will demonstrate themselves as "The Good Samaritan" also known as "The Good Neighbor." Let us face our fears with faith when we truly love one another with compassion in both words and actions. The last words from this Gospel passage is an admonition from Jesus "Go and do likewise!"
