The Pastor's Corner

Dear sisters and brothers,

Greetings!

Conflict resolution is a process to identify a present or potential problem and try to resolve by a consensus. It is completely new since there are antecedents in this weekend's readings such as Jeremiah being thrown in the cistern by a weak king's soldiers. They do not realize that the weak king is the problem not Jeremiah. Jeremiah prophecies warn of the fall of the kingdom of Judah to the Babylonians. He is trying to warn the people of Judah.



In today's Gospel passage from Luke, Jesus warns of division within the community who either accept him or reject him as the true Divine Savior. Jesus teaches us to learn to ACCEPT rejection in life. That is part of carrying the true Cross of Jesus Christ! The second reading from Hebrews offers Christians a New Testament way for conflict resolution. The opening verses of that letter reads: "Since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us and persevere in running the race that lies before us while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, the leader and perfecter of faith."

This New Testament passage ushers in a contemporary form of conflict resolution called "The Synod Process." Pope Francis in October 2021 called upon the Church for a Synod on Synodality. A synod is essentially an advisory group in both the international and local community such as a parish. Three years later after dialogue, debate, and discernment on the direction of the Catholic Church, a 51 page "Final Document" was approved and published in October 2024. Our parish of St. Francis of Assisi is catching up with this synodal process after a 2022 local synod meeting occurred in San Damiano Hall with then Pastor, Father Tom Gallagher, OFM.


Our parish synod committee has only been recently formed with some outstanding members of our parish who are really excited about the three priorities of our faith community: liturgy and spirituality; education/evangelization and social concerns. We hope to have another local Synod gathering in San Damiano Hall in mid-October with a special speaker from a local university who is well acquainted with the synodal process. Meanwhile, the Synod Committee along with the parish staff have produced a master calendar which includes dates and times of events pertinent to the three priorities. That master calendar will be shared in the following weekend of August 23-24 and for our weekday assembly as well later in the week.

We are journeying together as the People of God. One particular statement from Preparatory Synod Document 32 best describes this form of conflict resolution: "The purpose of this Synod is not to produce documents, but to plant dreams, draw forth prophesies and visions, inspire trust, bind up wounds, weave together relationships, awaken a dawn of hope, learn from one another and create a resourcefulness that will enlighten minds, warm hearts, give strength to our hands."

During the year 2025-2026, we will be journeying together!
