The Pastor's Corner

Dear sisters and brothers.

Greetings!

This weekend marks the end of "The Season of Creation" September 1 till October 4, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi. All this season was filled with lively celebrations of the Franciscan charism.



However, the Franciscan charism is not restricted to one month rather it is a timeless celebration of God's Gift of Creation.

T.S. Eliot once criticized certain poets by noting how they seem to think, "but they do not feel their thought." This is where Francis excelled: he felt his thoughts, and those thoughts were easily recognized in the poetry of his life as evidenced in his writing of the classic poem "The Canticle of the Creatures." This echoes the last verse of today's first reading from the Book of the Prophet Habakkuk" but the just one, because of his faith, shall live."

Francis was one of those rare people in the history of the world who do that most incredibly basic thing that we are asked to do: love. He looked at people in the eye and saw God in them. He saw God in the contorted face of the leper. He was so converted by this ability to love and care in the specific that he was able to come up the feeling with actions that were also extraordinary. Francis developed a reverence for every creature and thing he encountered, figuring that each had a mystery that could not possibly know but highly respected.

Francis treated his followers, the Poor Clare sisters and even the forerunners of the Secular Franciscan Order with love and respect. Francis often referred to the beginning of the Gospel passage this weekend from St. Luke when the apostles asked Jesus "Increase our faith." Jesus responded, "If you have the faith the size of a mustard seed." This meant that any expression of faith is multiplied through words and actions for apostolic work and advancing the Franciscan charism.

ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI SOCIAL CONCERNS SURVEY




