The Pastor's Corner

Dear sisters and brothers,

Greetings!

This weekend's Masses are meant to celebrate the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica. We will refer to a church building in a different way. Today's second reading is from the 1st Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians has a great opening verse about church building. "Brothers and sisters: YOU are God's building!".



WE the People of God are the CHURCH not just a brick and mortar building with stain glass windows. A few years ago, the late Pope Francis began the worldwide process of a Synod of Dialogue from the Vatican to the local parish in each nation. Pope Leo XIV has continued this Synodal process. In the past year, a Synod Committee has emerged in our wonderful parish. This Synod Committee is led by Ron Schramm, a full professor of business at Columbia University. The Committee is divided into three subcommittees: 1) Liturgy and Spiritual Life led by Paul Beetle along with Ellen Fishman, Pedro Tavarez and Samantha Romero. 2) Evangelization and Education led by Dario Corradini along with Sandy Boys. 3) Social Concerns led by Ron Schramm along with Eileen Leonard and Father Brian.

Each subcommittee chairperson will be reaching out to other devoted and committed parishioners to join these three committees to enhance the liturgical and pastoral life of the parish. We truly believe that we have the foundation to build up lay leadership in our parish from our parishioners and not just lay employees. There are many talented and gifted people in this iconic parish!

The Synod Committee agreed on a theme for our upcoming Advent season that begins on Saturday November 29 and goes until Christmas Eve December 24. The theme is "OUR LIVING HOPE." This pertains to the Jubilee Year of Hope instituted by the late Pope Francis for the calendar year 2025 until January 6, 2026. The theme is both communal and ongoing. To promote the importance of our Advent season, we have invited Professor Nathalie Imperatori-Lee of the Department of Theology at Fordham University to give an Advent Day of Recollection on Saturday December 6 from 12:30 pm to 3:30 pm. She will deliver a 20-25 minute talk entitled "OUR LIVING HOPE" followed by a lively discussion. The Advent Day of Recollection will take place in San Damiano Hall. All parishioners and friends are cordially invited.

Sisters and brothers, our parish is following the road for a synodal church. We will abide by that inspirational verse from today's second reading "Brothers and sisters: YOU are God's building!".

PASTORAL NOTES FOR NOVEMBER

- 1. Tuesday, November 11 is a Federal holiday. The office is closed and there will be no confessions. There will be only one Mass at 12 noon in the Lower Church.
- 2. At the end of all **Masses of November 15 and 16**, a member of our local Secular Franciscan groups will offer a brief reflection to recruit new members of the **Secular Franciscan Order**. All those interested are asked to speak to these SFO members.

At the end of all **Masses of November 22 and 23**, a member from our **Laudato Si Committee** will emphasize the importance of a letter writing campaign to our local elected Congresspeople and US Senators to increase the budget for the US Department of Agriculture. Sadly, the new Federal administration has severely cut the budget of the US Department of Agriculture while vastly increasing the budget of the US Department of Defense. For example, the average taxpayer is paying \$15,000.00 a year in taxes for the US Department of Defense while the same taxpayer is paying just one cent for the US Department of Agriculture. These are misplaced priorities! A bowl of rice is far more important than paying for another bomb!
