The Pastor's Corner

Dear sisters and brothers,

Greetings!

This third Sunday of Advent is known as Gaudete Sunday which in Latin means "rejoice." The candle will be pink to represent communal joy. The first reading from Isaiah intones our call to rejoice with the prophecy that God overcomes a variety of challenges to



nature. As the wasteland changes to lush land, the people rejoice. Isaiah weaves together a tapestry of people and things who rejoice in God's transformative work. The last verse from this passage of Isaiah reads "they will meet with joy and gladness, sorrow and mourning will flee."

In today's Gospel passage from Matthew, John the Baptist has a prominent role as the last of the Old Testament of the prophets. While preaching and preparing the way for Jesus Christ, John suddenly finds himself in prison. Jesus begins his public ministry while acknowledging the mission of John the Baptist, his earthly cousin. However, Jesus reveals to the People of God, his messianic mission to serve those both on Earth and in Heaven. Jesus proclaims at the end of the Gospel passage "there has been none greater than John the Baptist, yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he."

There are many prophets in our world today. The late Alexei Navalny was a dedicated prophet for freedom in Russia. It cost him his life. Maria Machado, this year's Nobel Peace Prize winner is a prophet for democracy and free elections in Venezuela. Doctors and nurses in Gaza are prophets for peace while bringing food and medical care to that war-stricken region. Imprisoned priests in Cameroon are prophets for religious liberty in Cameroon. Fired workers trying to organize labor unions in Amazon facilities are prophets for workers' rights. Protestors advocating for immigrants, asylees and refugees are prophets of the rule of law. The list goes on! We rejoice with them to bring the Kingdom of God here on Earth!
