# The Pastor's Corner

Dear sisters and brothers,

Blessings upon you for the new year of 2026!

This Sunday's Feast of the Baptism of the Lord marks the official end of the Christmas season. Jesus Christ is baptized into the River Jordan by John the Baptist—the last of the Old Testament prophets. The last verse of the Gospel passage from Matthew reads “This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well-pleased.” This baptism formally begins the public ministry of Jesus our Redeemer.



Speaking of ministry, the three subcommittees of our Synod Committee have formally begun their mission. On January 4, the **Education and Evangelization Committee** met and planned events for the 2026. On January 11, the **Liturgy and Spiritual Life Committee** met to discuss a theme for Lent which begins on Ash Wednesday, February 18. This same committee is planning a liturgical training day workshop to train new lectors, new Eucharistic ministers, hospitality ministers and adult altar servers. The **Social Concerns Committee** has already contributed ideas for the Lenten theme and has planned a Catholic Social Teaching workshop for all parishioners and friends on Saturday afternoon, January 24 from 2:00 pm till 3:30 pm. The workshop asks for a free will offering and light refreshments will be served.

The Synod Committee will gradually become our first parish council. This parish council will be composed of these three subcommittees and will issue monthly reports from October till June of each year. Please excuse our slow evolution but we prefer to be careful that this parish council will actually work out for the benefit of our parish and the local community.

Our parish council is formed by God in the words of today's first reading from Isaiah “I formed you, and set you as a covenant for the people, a light for the nations.” Let us enlighten each other during the year 2026.
