Dear sisters and brothers,

Greetings!

This weekend marks the Federal holiday celebrating Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.. Dr. King became the first African American who was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964 for his courageous witness for civil rights.

Dr. King emanates the meaning of today's response from Psalm 40 "Here I am Lord, I come to do your will." Dr. King's last witness as a servant leader was on the day of his untimely murder in April 1968. He was preaching in solidarity for sanitation workers who wanted to unionize in Memphis, Tenn.



This week also marks the Week for Christian Unity in which Christians from all denominations are called to gather in an ecumenical spirit to highlight our similarities rather than our differences. We all rejoice in the verse from today's first reading from Isaiah "The Lord said to me, You are my servant."

This Wednesday, January 21 at the 12 noon Mass, we invite all parishioners and friends to join us we celebrate the Week for Christian Unity Week. Immediately after the 12 noon Mass will be a special guest speaker. He is the Reverend Terence Melvin, a Baptist minister and the Secretary Treasurer of the New York State AFL-CIO. Rev. Melvin will preach about workers' rights and the dignity of the human person from an ecumenical perspective.

Rev. Melvin will challenge us to strengthen our ecumenical bonds as Christians. He will epitomize the words of Dr. King's 1967 Christmas sermon "If we are to have peace on earth, our loyalties must become ecumenical rather than sectional. Our loyalties must transcend race, our class and our nation; and this means we must develop a world perspective."

Please join us in the Workers' Chapel on Wednesday, January 21 at the 12 noon Mass!
